STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS OCTOBER 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 70,665,060 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 70,270,260 lb. and 394,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 3,081,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 48,125,203 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 22,145,057 lb. or 31.5 per cent.

The summary total was lower than last year by 835 thousand lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of September was 2.7 million lb. (being 10.5 per cent of the September production figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.9 million lb. for September 1945. The five-year average of stocks was 63,020,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at October 1, 1946 amounted to 18,256 lb. which was a decrease of 38,290 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 344,289 lb. of this product on hand on October 1, 1946 as compared with 433,109 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 39,109,831 lb. consisting of 38,731,080 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,883,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 74,751 lb. Imported and 304,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 24.1 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of October 1, 1945. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for September was 3.8 million lb. (being 8.9 per cent of the September 1, revised stock figures as compared with a like movement of 1.5 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 27,341,760 lb. which was a decrease of 12.2 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 2.0 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 4,361,481 lb., a decrease of 1.2 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 792 thousand lb. from last month or 15.4 per cent.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 8,512,724 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,796,662 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 10,309,386 dozens on October 1, as compared with 13,776,185 dozen on October 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at October 1, 1946 amounted to 1,404,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 9,475,504 lb. being 17.6 million lb. less than the 1945 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for September 1946 was 1.1 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 1.9 million lb. during September 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY

On October 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 12,247,328 lb. being an increase of 5.8 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,103,083 lb., fowl to 3,911,756 lb. and turkeys to 299,045 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 4.0 million lb. is shown for September 1946 as compared with a similar movement of 802 thousand lb. for the same month last year.

There were 100,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on October 1, 1946.
