

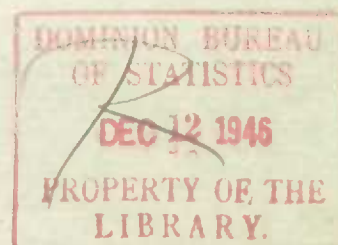

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS DECEMBER 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on December 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 55,982,083 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 55,807,083 lb. and 175,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,238,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 36,199,237 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 19,607,846 lb. or 35.1 per cent.

The summary total was higher than last year by 5.0 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of November was 10.5 million lb. (being 15.8 per cent of the revised November 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 13.8 million lb. for November 1945. The five-year average was 50,028,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at December 1, 1946 amounted to 19,107 lb. which was a decrease of 4,590 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 235,454 lb. of this product on hand on December 1, 1946 as compared with 276,612 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 26,048,569 lb. consisting of 25,801,953 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 743,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time,) 94,616 lb. Imported and 152,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was a decrease of 17.4 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of December 1, 1945. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for November was 6.4 million lb. (being 20.0 per cent of the November 1, revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 11.8 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers, amounted to 18,938,915 lb. which was a decrease of 5.3 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for November was 3.3 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 3,058,812 lb. an increase of 264 thousand lb. over last year and a decrease of 988 thousand lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of only 8,545 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,430,568 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 1,439,113 dozens on December 1, as compared with 539,135 dozens on December 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at December 1, 1946 amounted to 108,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 6,868,596 lb. being 7.4 million lb. less than the 1945 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for November 1946 was 1.5 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 7.8 million lb. during November 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY

On December 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 26,104,493 lb., being an increase of 10.7 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 12,366,365 lb. fowl to 8,905,362 lb. and turkeys to 891,857 lb., not including estimates. An "Intp-Storage" movement of 8.0 million lb. is shown for November 1946 as compared with a similar movement of 5.6 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were 100,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on December 1, 1946.
