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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MARCH 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on March 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 9,870,366 lb. made up of Canadian make in Storage 9,650,566 lb. and 219,800 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 421,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 5,742,390 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 3,908,176 lb. or 40.5 per cent.

The summary total was less than last year by 10.8 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of February was 12.7 million lb. (being 56.8 per cent of the February 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 10.1 million lb. for February 1945. The five-year average of stocks was 18,625,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at March 1, 1946 amounted to 17,304 lb. which was a decrease of 34,478 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 78,688 lb. of this product on hand on March 1, 1946 as compared with 66,915 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 19,174,608 lb. consisting of 18,965,908 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 404,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 56,700 lb. Imported and 152,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 4.7 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of March 1, 1945. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for February was 5.2 million lb. (being 21.4 per cent of the February 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 6.1 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 6,963,176 lb. which was a decrease of 11.3 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for February was 4.3 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 780,304 lb., a decrease of 2.0 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 402 thousand lb. from last month or 34.0 per cent.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 497,160 dozens.

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,960,434 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 2,457,594 dozens on March 1, as compared with 2,925,175 dozens on March 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at March 1, 1946 amounted to 5,022,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 4,488,208 lb. being 75.0 per cent less than the 1945 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for February 1946 was 898 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 6.4 million lb. during February 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY

On March 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 9,672,269 lb., being a decrease of 6.4 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,727,297 lb., fowl to 4,007,176 lb. and turkeys to 1,006,676 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.6 million lb. is shown for February 1946 as compared with a like movement of 4.8 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 225,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on March 1, 1946.
