STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS APRIL 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on April 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 5,320,054 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 5,145,054 lb. and 175,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 246,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy Factories had in store 3,470,812 lb. or 67.6 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 1,668,242 lb.

The summary total was less than last year by 8.2 million 1b. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of March was 4.5 million 1b. (being 46.8 per cent of the March 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 7.3 million 1b. for March 1945. The five-year average of stocks was 11,434,000 1b.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at April 1, 1946 amounted to 19,101 lb. which was a decrease of 6,232 lb.

from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 44,910 lb. of this product on hand on April 1, 1946 as compared with 51,550 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 18,516,443 lb. consisting of 18,346,064 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 253,000 1b. for firms that did not report on time), 56,379 lb. Imported and 114,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 1.9 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of April 1, 1945. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for March was 1.5 million lb. (being 7.8 per cent of the March 1 revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.5 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 10,436,766 lb. which was a decrease of 9.6 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 3.5 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 764,485 lb., a decrease of 2.3 million lb. from last year and a decrease of 59 thousand lb. from last month or 7.1 per cent.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 1,982,894 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,273,476 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 5,256,370 dozens on April 1, as compared with 5,917,775 dozens on April 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at April 1, 1946 amounted to 3,330,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 3,869,461 lb. being 67.1 per cent less than the 1945 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for March 1946 was 631 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 6.2 million lb. during March 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY On April 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 6,486,208 lb. being a decrease of 4.5 million lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,642,987 lb., fowl to 2,509,190 lb. and turkeys to 850,502 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.9 million lb. is shown for March 1946 as compared with a like movement of 5.1 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were also 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on April 1, 1946.
