

### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, MAY 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on May 1, 1946 the Summary of Greamery Butter in Canada amounted to 6,847,612 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 6,287,612 lb. and 560,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 761,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time. It may be stated that this is the first time in twenty years that May I total stocks have been higher than those of April 1.

Dairy factories had in store 4,963,219 lb. or 78.9 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 1,324,393 lb.

The summary total was less than last year by 5.8 million 1b. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of April was 1.1 million 1b. (being 5.6 per cent of the April production figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 752 thousand lb. for April 1945. The five-year average of stocks was 9,982,000 lb.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 20,714,936 lb. consisting of 20,634,342 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 738,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 42,594 lb. Imported and 38,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 5.2 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of May 1, 1945. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for April was 2.7 million lb. (being 39.0 per cent of the April Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 5.6 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,033,488 lb. which was a decrease of 9.5 million 1b. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for April was 2.6 million 1b. The chief by-product Skim-bilk Pewder amounted to 1,173,519 lb., a decrease of 2,6 million lb. from last year and an increase of 449 thousand 1b. over last month or 62.0 per cent.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 7,565,568 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,179,020 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 10,744,588 dozens on May 1, as compared with 14,199,948 dozens on May 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at May 1, 1946 amounted to 1,674,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 4,841,103 lb. being 58.4 per cent less than the 1945 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for April 1946 was 1.0 million lb. as compared with an opposite movement of lll thousand lb. during April 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY On May 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 4,442,513 lb. being a decrease of 3.6 million 1b. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,539,976 lb., fowl to 1,829,803 lb. and turkeys to 694,707 lb., not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 2.0 million lb. is shown for April 1946 as compared with a like movement of 2.9 million 1b. for the same month last year.
