

### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS JUNE 1, 1946

### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on June 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 18,129,181 1b. made up of Canadian make in storage 17,349,381 1b. and 779,800 1b. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,596,000 1b. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy factories had in store 9,891,645 lb. or 57.0 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 7,457,736 1b.

The summary total was less than last year by 1.4 million 1b. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May was 11.1 million 1b. (being 35.3 per cent of the May production figures) as compared with a like movement of 7.0 million 1b. for May 1945. The five-year average of stocks was 17,636,000 1b.

#### DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at June 1, 1946 amounted to 29,045 lb. which was a

decrease of 20,993 lb. from last year.

### WHEY BUTTER

There were 94,610 lb. of this product on hand on June 1, 1946 as compared with 143,270 lb. for the

same month last year.

### CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 31,534,705 lb. consisting of 31,264,374 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,593,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 118,331 lb. Imported and 152,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 10.1 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of June 1, 1945. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for May was 10.1 million 1b. (being 64.1 per cent of the May Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 15.5 million 1b. last

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 16,665,075 lb. which was a decrease of 18.2 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 3.6 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 1,988,672 lb., a decrease of 3.5 million lb. from last year and an increase of 775 thousand 1b. over last month or 65.9 per cent.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 11,150,710 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,945,508 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 14,096,218 dozens on June 1, as compared with 18,235,530 dozens on June 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at June 1, 1946 amounted to 162,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 7,364,587 lb. being 10.8 million lb. less than the 1945 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for May 1946 was 2.5 million 1b. as compared with a similar movement of 6.5 million 1b. during May 1945.

### DRESSED POULTRY

On June 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 3,380,952 lb. being a decrease of 2.5 million 1b. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,061,368 lb., fowl to 1,360,255 lb. and turkeys to 546,654 lb., not including estimates. An \*Out-of-Storage\* movement of 1.1 million lb. is shown for May 1946 as compared with a like movement of 2.2 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were no dressed poultry in Carloads on

June 1, 1946.
