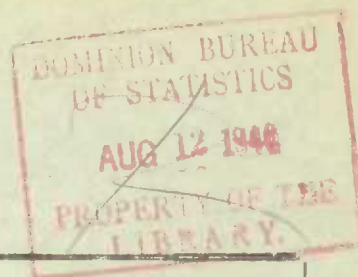

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS AUGUST 1, 1946

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on August 1, 1946 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 58,555,212 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 57,995,212 lb. and 560,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,413,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold storage warehouses had in store 37,243,803 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 20,751,409 lb. or 35.8 per cent.

The summary total was higher than last year by 2.0 million lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of July was 19.5 million lb. (being 47.6 per cent of the July production figures) as compared with a like movement of 17.0 million lb. for July 1945. The five-year average of stocks was 53,682,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at August 1, 1946 amounted to 47,029 lb. which was a decrease of 62,063 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 306,122 lb. of this product on hand on August 1, 1946 as compared with 329,653 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 52,533,918 lb. consisting of 51,808,386 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 2,929,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time), 117,532 lb. Imported and 608,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of the railway companies. There was a decrease of 14.6 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of August 1, 1945. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for July was 947 thousand lb. (being 3.7 per cent of the July Production figures) as compared with a like movement of 1.8 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 25,749,692 lb. which was a decrease of 19.1 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for July was 302 thousand lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder amounted to 3,874,343 lb., a decrease of 3.3 million lb. from last year and an increase of 401 thousand lb. over last month or 11.5 per cent.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 13,735,647 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,118,795 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 15,854,442 dozens on August 1, as compared with 20,717,100 dozen on August 1, 1945. Shell Eggs in transit at August 1, 1946 amounted to 252,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 9,974,390 lb. being 19.9 million lb. less than the 1945 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for July 1946 was 420 thousand lb. as compared with a similar movement of 4.1 million lb. during July 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY

On August 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 6,484,770 lb. being a decrease of 464 thousand lb. from last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,900,803 lb., fowl to 2,545,579 lb. and turkeys to 451,864 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 1.9 million lb. is shown for July 1946 as compared with a similar movement of 777 thousand lb. for the same month last year.

There were no dressed poultry in Carloads on August 1, 1946.
