

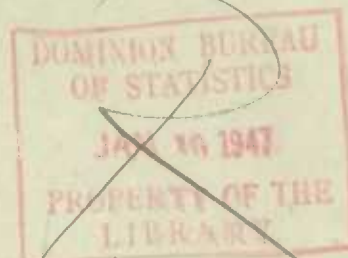

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS JANUARY 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 43,919,807 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 43,495,607 lb. and 424,200 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,788,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage warehouses had in store 27,078,793 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 16,416,814 lb. or 37.7 per cent.

The summary total was higher than last year by 7.7 million lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of December was 13.5 million lb. (being 23.7 per cent of the revised December 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 15.1 million lb. for December 1945. The five-year average was 38,162,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at January 1, 1947 amounted to 10,767 lb. which was a decrease of 53,407 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 176,395 lb. of this product on hand on January 1, 1947 as compared with 215,419 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 25,768,722 lb. consisting of 25,580,449 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 773,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 112,273 lb. Imported and 76,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was a decrease of 929 thousand lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of January 1, 1946. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian cheese for December was 130 thousand lb. (being 0.5 per cent of the December 1, revised stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 16.7 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers, amounted to 12,700,131 lb. which was a decrease of 5.7 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for December was 6.1 million lb. The chief by-product, Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 1,887,898 lb. an increase of 65 thousand lb. over last year and a decrease of 1.1 million lb. from last month.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of only 14,358 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,431,375 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 2,445,733 dozens on January 1, as compared with 1,953,146 dozens on January 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at January 1, 1947 amounted to 2,178,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 5,442,787 lb. being 3.2 million lb. less than the 1946 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for December 1946 was 1.4 million lb. as compared with a similar movement of 5.6 million lb. during December 1945.

DRESSED POULTRY

On January 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 30,398,570 lb., being an increase of 14.1 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 12,923,438 lb. fowl to 8,356,577 lb. and turkeys to 3,203,302 lb., not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 4.4 million lb. is shown for December 1946 as compared with a similar movement of 873 thousand lb. for the same month last year.

There were 75,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on January 1, 1947.
