STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS OCTOBER 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on October 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 73,497,193 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 72,832,193 lb. and 665,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 3,721,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 51,647,898 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 21,184,295 lb. or 29.1 per cent. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of September was 6.3 million lb. (being 18.9 per cent of the September production figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.1 million lb. for September 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 2.7 million 1b. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 6.6 million 1b. The five year average was 68,464,000 1b.

DAIRY BUTTER The stocks of this commodity as reported at October 1, 1947 amounted to 7,898 1b. which was a decrease of 12,099 1b. from last year.

WHEY BUTTLR

There were 278,233 lb. of this product on hand on October 1, 1947 as compared with 346,385 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE The Summary total of Cheese was 49,289,218 lb. consisting of 48,853,925 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 2,530,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 17,293 lb. Imported and 418,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was an increase of 9.8 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of October 1, 1946. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for September was 6.8 million lb. (being 12.3 per cent of the September stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.5 million lb. last year.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 9.9 million 1b. and showed an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 7.1 million 1b.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 16,427,782 lb. which was a decrease of 10.9 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 4.9 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-milk Powder, amounted to 9,985,038 lb. an increas of 1.4 million lb. over last month, and an increase of 5.3 million lb. over last

FGGS Cold Storage Fggs came to a total of 14,589,351 dozens. Fresh Fggs totalled 2,262,605 dozens. Shell Fggs in stock were 16,851,956 dozens on October 1, 1947 compared with 10,294,104 dozens on October 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at October 1, 1947 amounted to 2,088,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 16,744,888 lb. being 7.3 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for September 1947 was 282 thousand lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 1.2 million lb. during September 1946. The Special Products Board held 586,799 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY On October 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 17,584,802 lb. being an increase of 5.5 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,473,776 lb. fowl to 7,583,212 lb. and turkeys to 1,637,220 lb. not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 2.0 million lb. is shown for September 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 3.8 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on October 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 5.4 million 1b. An "Into-Storage" movement of 2.0 million 1b. is shown for the month of September 1947. There were 50,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on October 1, 1947.
