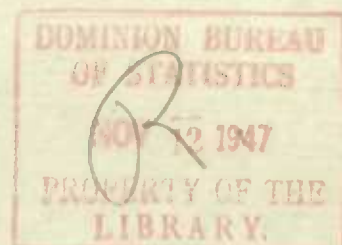

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS NOVEMBER 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on November 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 70,969,350 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 70,449,950 lb. and 519,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 3,099,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 50,167,791 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 20,282,159 lb. or 28.8 per cent. The net "out-of-storage" movement for the month of October was 2.3 million lb. (being 3.1 per cent of the revised October 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.5 million lb. for October 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 3.9 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.4 million lb. The five year average was 62,614,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER The stocks of this commodity as reported at November 1, 1947 amounted to 6,555 lb. which was a decrease of 19,179, lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER There were 247,513 lb. of this product on hand on November 1, 1947 as compared with 309,649 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE The Summary total of Cheese was 42,933,748 lb. consisting of 42,652,053 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,086,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 15,695 lb. Imported and 266,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was an increase of 10.2 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of November 1, 1946. The net "out-of-storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for October was 8.6 million lb. (being 16.8 per cent of the October 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 6.7 million lb. last year.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 9.9 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 8.8 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,188,450 lb. which was a decrease of 9.1 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for October was 3.2 million lb. The chief by-product Skimmilk powder, amounted to 9,019,464 lb. a decrease of 753 thousand lb. from last month, and an increase of 5.0 million lb. over last year.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 3,982,160 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,871,733 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 5,853,893 dozens on November 1, 1947 compared with 2,912,857 dozens on November 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at November 1, 1947 amounted to 1,638,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 14,702,137 lb. being 6.3 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement for October 1947 was 1.7 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.0 million lb. during October 1946. The Special Products Board held 586,799 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY On November 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 22,181,313 lb. being an increase of 3.9 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,993,333 lb. fowl to 10,007,923 lb. and turkeys to 1,328,949 lb. not including estimates. An "into-storage" movement of 4.7 million lb. is shown for October 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 6.2 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on November 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 3.9 million lb. An "into-storage" movement of 4.7 million lb. is shown for the month of October 1947. There were 150,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads November 1, 1947.
