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

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS DECEMBER 1, 1947

<u>CREAMERY BUTTER</u> At the opening of business on December 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 59,302,067 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 58,572,667 lb. and 729,400 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 940,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 41,729,654 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 16,843,013 lb. or 28.8 per cent. The net "out-of-storage" movement for the month of November was 12.0 million lb. (being 17.0 per cent of the revised November 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 10.2 million lb. for November 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 2.4 million 1b. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 11.8 million 1b. The five year average was 50.541,000 1b.

DAIRY BUTTER The stocks of this commodity as reported at December 1, 1947 amounted to 9,413 lb. which was a decrease of 10,263 lb. from lest year.

WHEY BUTTER There were 208,682 lb. of this product on hand on December 1, 1947 as compared with 239,600 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE The Summary total of Cheese was 37,776,943 lb. consisting 37,342,548 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 458,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 16,595 lb. Imported and 418,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was an increase of 11.7 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of November 1, 1946. The net "out-of-storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for November was 6.1 million lb. (being 14.0 per cent of the November 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 6.7 million lb. last year.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 11.8 million 1b. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.9 million 1b.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 6,459,898 lb. which was a decrease of 12.3 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for November was 6.7 million lb. The chief by-product Skimmilk powder, amounted to 6,402,676 lb. a decrease of 2.8 million lb. from last month, and an increase of 3.4 million lb. over last year.

EGGS <u>Cold Storage Eggs</u> came to a total of 1,056,950 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,614,552 dozens. <u>Shell Eggs</u> in stock were 2,671,502 dozens on December 1, 1947 compared with 1,462,189 dozens on December 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at December 1, 1947 amounted to 810,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 13,171,551 lb. being 6.3 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "out-of-stornge" movement for November 1947 was 1.7 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.5 million lb. during November 1946. The Special Products Board held 320,000 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY On December 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 30,165,875 lb. being an increase of 4.0 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock emounted to 11,384,389 lb. fowl to 12,318,052 lb. end turkeys to 2,074,839 lb. not including estimates. An "into-storage" movement of 8.0 million lb. is shown for November 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 7.9 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on December 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 4.6 million 1b. An "into-storage" movement of 8.5 million 1b. is shown for the month of November 1947. There were 675,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads December 1, 1947.
