

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - APRIL 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 15,177,225 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 14,171,353 lb., 760,872 lb. Imported and 245,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,108,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy Factories had in store 8,218,812 lb. or 58.0 per cent. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 5,952,541 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of March was 7.7 million lb. (being 35.2 per cent. of the revised March 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 4.5 million lb. for March 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 9.8 million 1b. and showed an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 8.9 million 1b. The five-year average was 11,297,000 1b.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at April 1, 1947 amounted to 8,647 lb. which was a decrease of 13,776 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 52,733 lb. of this product on hand on April 1, 1947 as compared with 44,206 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE The summary total of cheese was 18,818,577 lb. consisting of 18,636,447 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 471,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 144,130 lb. Imported and 38,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was an increase of 634 thousand lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of April 1, 1946. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement of Cheese for March 1947 was 1.4 million lb. (being 6.8 per cent. of the March 1, revised stock figures as compared with a like movement of 1.9 million lb. last year.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 13,910,476 lb. which was an increase of 3.5 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 3.4 million lb. The chief by-product Skim Milk Powder, amounted to 2,465,845 lb. an increase of 1.7 million lb. over last year and an increase of 540,000 lb. over last month.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 3,117,066 dozens. Fresh Eggs total led 3,129,181 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 6,246,247 dozens on April 1, as compared with 5,304,181 dozens on April 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at April 1, 1947 amounted to 540,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 4,010,612 lb. being 171 thousand lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for March 1947 was 317 thousand lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 663 thousand lb. during March 1946. The Special Products Board held 127,289 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY The summary total of poultry stocks on April 1 was 16,514,284 lb. being an increase of 10.0 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,165,411 lb. fowl to 4,138,596 lb. and turkeys to 3,853,653 lb. not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 5.9 million lb. is shown for March 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 2.9 million lb. for the same month last year.

There were 50,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on April 1, 1947.

NOTE: The 1947 storage movements are based on the totals shown in the respective summaries.
