STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS MAY 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 11,207,117 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 10,202,117 lb., 945,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,338,000 1b. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy Factories had in store 6,511,627 lb. or 63.5 per cent.of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 3,750,490 lb. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for the month of April was 4.1 million 1b. (Being 28.3 per cent. of the revised April stock figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 1.0 million lb. for April 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 4.4 million lb. and showed an "Out-of-Storage" movement of 4.1 million 1b. The five-year average was 9,344,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at May 1, 1947 amounted to 22,033 lb. which was a decrease of 5,769 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 38,803 lb. of this product on hand on May 1, 1947 as compared with 53,363 lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of Cheese was 19,290,590 lb. consisting of 18,972,350 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 701,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 90,240 lb. Imported and 228,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was a decrease of 2.3 million 1b. from the Canadian storage stocks of May 1, 1946. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for April was 311 thousand 1b. (being 6.0 per cent. of the April production figures) as compared with a like movement of 3.2 million 1b. last year.

The Summary total was lower than last year by 2.0 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 447 thousand 10.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 19,910,730 1b. which was an increase of 6.9 million 1b. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for April was 6.0 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 3,573,758 lb. an increase of 1.2 million lb. over last month. and an increase of 2.3 million lb. over last year.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 8,342,785 dozens. Fresh Eggs total led 4,955,833 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 13,298,616 dozens on May 1, 1947 compared with 11,101,474 dozens on May 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at May 1, 1947 amounted to 792,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 5,671,744 lb. being 820,000 lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for April 1947 was 1.7 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.0 million 1b. during April 1946. The Special Products Board held 127,289 1b. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY On May 1 total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 13,126,916 1b. being an increase of 8.7 million 1b. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,233,566 1b. fowl to 3,405,566 1b. and turkeys to 3,381,912 1b. not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.5 million lb. is shown for April 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 2.0 million 1b. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on May 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 8.7 million 1b. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 3.6 million 1b. is shown for the month of April 1947.

There were also 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on May 1, 1947.
