STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - JUNE 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on June 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 23,533,331 lb. made up of Canadian made in storage 22,798,331 lb., 735,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,793,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy Factories had in store 11,906,090 lb. or 52.2 per cent of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 10,892,241 lb. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of May was 12.6 million lb. (Being 40.2 per cent of the May production figures) as compared with a like movement of 11.2 million lb. for May 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 5.3 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 12.4 million lb. The five-year average was 17,285,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at June 1, 1947 amounted to 24,536 lb. which was a decrease of 7,536 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 129,584 lb. of this product on hand on June 1, 1947 as compared with 104,032 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of Cheese was 27,034,220 lb. consisting of 26,336,940 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,207,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 83,280 lb. Imported and 114,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was a decrease of 5.2 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of June 1, 1946. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for May was 7.6 million lb. (being 61.9 per cent of the May production figures) as compared with a like movement of 10.8 million lb. last year.

The Summary total was lower than last year by 5.2 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 7.4 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 26,595,294 lb. which was an increase of 9.9 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 6.7 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-Milk Powder, amounted to 5,243,975 lb. an increase of 1.6 million lb. over last month, and an increase of 3.2 million lb. over last year.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 17,760,406 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 6,601,538 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 24,361,944 dozens on June 1, 1947 compared with 14,681,049 dozens on June 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at June 1, 1947 amounted to 360,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 9,639,723 lb. being 2.3 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for May 1947 was 3.9 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 2.3 million lb. during May 1946. The Special Products Board held 127,289 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On June 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 11,721,970 lb. being an increase of 8.3 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,178,912 lb. fowl to 3,424,734 lb. and turkeys to 3,304,535 lb. not including estimates. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.5 million lb. is shown for May 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 1.0 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on June 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 8.4 million lb. An "Out-of-Storage" movement of 1.4 million lb. is shown for the month of May 1947.

There were also 100,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on June 1, 1947 and 12,105 lb. Imported.
