STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS- JULY 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 42,349,600 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 41,344,800 lb., 805,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 2,233,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 26,085,922 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 15,458,678 lb. or 37.2 per cent. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of June was 18.7 million lb. (being 43.3 per cent of the June production figures) as compared with a like movement of 21.0 million lb. for June 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 2.5 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 18.7 million lb. The five-year average was 37,564,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported as July 1, 1947 amounted to 8,294 lb. which was a decrease of 22,113 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 221,059 lb. of this product on hand on July 1, 1947 as compared with 216,310 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 42,093,046 lb. consisting of 40,858,237 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 2,595,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 18,809 lb. Imported and 1,216,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was a decrease of 10.3 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of July 1, 1946. The net "into-storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for June was 14.5 million lb. (being 64.8 per cent of the June production figures) as compared with a like movement of 19.2 million lb. last year.

The Summary total was lower than last year by 9.5 million lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 15.6 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 16,555,051 lb. which was a decrease of 8.9 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 10.0 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-milk Powder, amounted to 7,384,772 lb. an increase of 2.2 million lb. over last month, and an increase of 3.6 million lb. over last year.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 22,873,990 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 3,233,082 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 26,107,072 dozens on July 1, 1947 compared with 16,208,153 dozens on July 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at July 1, 1947 amounted to 108,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 13,700,346 lb. being 4.0 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "into-storage" movement for June 1947 was 4.1 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 2.4 million lb. during June 1946. The Special Products Board held 200,139 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On July 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 11,869,642 lb. being an increase of 7.3 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,787,174 lb. fowl to 3,752,095 lb. and turkeys to 3,076,591 lb. not including estimates. An "into-storage" movement of 264 thousand lb. is shown for June 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 1.2 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on July 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 7.3 million lb. An "into-storage" movement of 226 million lb. is shown for the month of June 1947. There were also 75,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on June 1, 1947.
