STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS
AUGUST 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on August 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 58,560,114 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 58,035,114 lb. 525,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 3,338,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 40,639,431 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 17,395,683 lb. or 30.0 per cent. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of July was 16.2 million lb. (being 38.3 per cent of the July production figures) as compared with a like movement of 19.4 million lb. for July 1946.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 128 thousand and showed an "into-storage" movement of 15.9 million lb. The five-year average was 54.979,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at August 1, 1947 amounted to 8,324 lb. which was a decrease of 40,993 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 315,043 lb. of this product on hand on August 1, 1947 as compared with 317,238 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The summary total of cheese was 48,693,427 lb. consisting of 48,255,004 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 3,117,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 20,423 lb. Imported and 418,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was a decrease of 3.8 million lb. from the Canadian storage stocks of August 1, 1946. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for July was 7.6 million lb. (being 34.0 per cent of the July production figures) as compared with a like movement of 944 thousand lb. last year.

The Summary total was lower than last year by 4.1 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 6.8 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 19,414,291 lb. which was a decrease of 6.3 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for July was 2.7 million lb. The chief by-product Skim- milk Powder, amounted to 7,608,133 lb. an increase of 123 thousand lb. over last month, and an increase of 3.6 million lb. over last year.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 22,687,105 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,843,136 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 25,530,571 dozens on August 1, 1947 compared with 15,772,500 dozens on August 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at August 1, 1947 amounted to 558,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 16,451,890 lb. being 6.4 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "Into-Storage" movement for July 1947 was 2.6 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 388 thousand lb. during July 1946. The Special Products Board held 586,799 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY On August 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 12,872,835 lb. being an increase of 6.4 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,386,880 lb. fowl to 3,871,416 lb. and turkeys to 2,147,137 lb. not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 870 thousand lb. is shown for July 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 1.9 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on August 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 6.6 million lb. An "Into-Storage" movement of 992 thousand lb. is shown for the month of July 1947. There were also 200,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on August 1, 1947.
