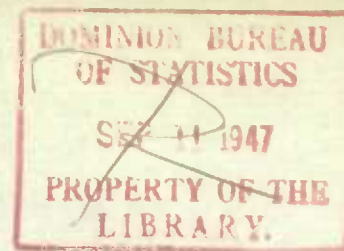

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS SEPTEMBER 1, 1947

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on September 1, 1947 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 66,938,781 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 66,553,781 lb. and 385,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 1,748,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 47,252,559 lb. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while dairy factories held the remaining 19,301,222 lb. or 29.0 per cent. The net "Into-Storage" movement for the month of August was 8.1 million lb. (being 22.1 per cent of the August production figures) as compared with a like movement of 9.4 million lb. for August 1946.

The Summary total was lower than last year by 1.6 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 7.9 million lb. The five year average was 65,362,000 lb.

DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at September 1, 1947 amounted to 10,264 lb. which was a decrease of 7,019 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER

There were 381,891 lb. of this product on hand on September 1, 1947 as compared with 353,174 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE

The Summary total of Cheese was 56,046,614 lb. consisting of 55,306,363 lb. Canadian (including an estimate of 1,823,000 lb. for firms that did not report on time) 18,251 lb. Imported and 722,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was an increase of 12.7 million lb. over the Canadian storage stocks of September 1, 1946. The net "Into-Storage" movement of Canadian Cheese for August was 7.1 million lb. (being 38.1 per cent of the August production figures) as compared with an opposite movement of 9.5 million lb. last year.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 12.9 million lb. and showed an "Into-Storage" movement of 7.4 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 21,364,886 lb. which was a decrease of 8.0 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "Into-Storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for August was 2.0 million lb. The chief by-product Skim-milk Powder, amounted to 8,537,146 lb. an increase of 523 thousand lb. over last month, and an increase of 3.3 million lb. over last year.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 23,341,253 dozens. Fresh Eggs totalled 2,712,832 dozens. Shell Eggs in stock were 26,054,085 dozens on September 1, 1947 compared with 14,377,226 dozens on September 1, 1946. Shell Eggs in transit at September 1, 1947 amounted to 846,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 16,286,939 lb. being 5.7 million lb. higher than the 1946 figures. The net "Out-of-Storage" movement for August 1947 was 14 thousand lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 523 thousand lb. during August 1946. The Special Products Board held 586,799 lb. melange of the above total.

DRESSED POULTRY

On September 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 15,083,000 lb. being an increase of 6.7 million lb. over last year's figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,908,332 lb. fowl to 6,513,327 lb. and turkeys to 1,968,378 lb. not including estimates. An "Into-Storage" movement of 1.7 million lb. is shown for August 1947 as compared with a similar movement of 1.9 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on September 1, 1947 was higher than last year by 6.6 million lb. An "Into-Storage" movement of 1.5 million lb. is shown for the month of August 1947. There were 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in Carloads on September 1, 1947.
