

#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - OCTOBER 1, 1948

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1918 the stocks of creamery butter in Canada amounted to 53,434,562 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 52,979,562 lb. and 455,000 lb. in transit. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 33,818,322 lb. while dairy factories held the remaining 19,161,240 lb. or 36.2 per cent. The Summary total was lower than last year by 19.9 million lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 2.4 million lb. The five year average was 72,497,000 lb.

CHEESE
The total stocks of cheese were 49,928,787 lb. consisting of 49,572,096 lb. Canadian, 14,691 lb. Imported and 342,000 lb. in transit. The Summary Total was lower than last year by 2.1 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.6 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 27,456,173 lb. which was an increase of 11.0 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for September was 564 thousand lb. The chief by-product Skimmilk Powder, amounted to 9,452,370 lb. a decrease of 421 thousand lb. from last year and an increase of 322 thousand lb. over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 2,446,678 lb. on October 1 and 2,523,490 lb. on September 1, 1948.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 5,056,695 dozens

Fresh Eggs totalled 1,452,193 dozens, Shell Eggs in stock were 6,508,888 dozens on October 1, 1948, as compared with 16,948,735 dozens on October 1, 1947. Shell Eggs in transit at October 1, 1948 amounted to 1,602,000 dozens. Frozen Eggs totalled 10,716,059 lb. being 5.7 million lb. lower than the 1947 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement for September 1948 was 10 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 37 thousand pounds during September 1947.

DRESSED POULTRY

The Summary total of poultry stocks on October 1, 1948
was lower than last year by 6.8 million 1b. An "into-storage" movement of 2.3 million 1b.
is shown for the month of September 1948. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,336,783 lb.
fowl to 4,831,989 lb. and turkeys to 1,574,407 lb. not including estimates. There were
25,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on October 1, 1948.
