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#### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - NOVEMBER 1, 1948

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on November 1, 1948 the stocks of creamery butter in Canada amounted to 52,174,972 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 48,874,832 lb., 2,660,340 lb. Imported and 639,800 lb. in transit. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 29,633,564 lb. while dairy factories held the remaining 19,241,268 lb. or 39.4 per cent. The summary total was lower than last year by 19.0 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 1.5 million lb. The five year average was 67,961,000 lb.

The total stocks of cheese were 43,429,639 lb. consisting of 42,918,804 lb. Canadian 54,835 lb. Imported and 456,000 lb. in transit. The Summary total was lower than last year by 415 thousand lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 6.9 million lb.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 21,438,559 lb. which was an increase of 8.3 million lb. overlast year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for October was 6.0 million lb. The chief by-product skimmilk powder, amounted to 9,017,674 lb. a decrease of 185 thousand lb. from last year and a decrease of 310 thousand lb. from last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 2,614,189 lb. on November 1, and 2,406,182 lb. on October 1, 1948.

EGGS Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 335,678 dozens Fresh Eggs totalled 928,035 dozens, Shell Eggs in stock were 1,263,713 dozens on November 1, 1948 as compared with 5,573,635 dozens on November 1, 1947. Shell Eggs in transit at November 1, 1948 amounted to 396,000 dozens. Frozen Eggs totalled 10,005,250 lb. being 4.9 million lb. lower than the 1947 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement for October 1948 was 713 thousand lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.5 million pounds during October 1947.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on November 1, 1948 was lower than last year by 8.3 million 1b. An "into-storage" movement of 3.2 million 1b. is shown for the month of October 1948. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,731,654 lb. fow 1 to 7,100,734 lb. and turkeys to 1,090,593 lb. not including estimates. There were 150,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on November 1, 1948.
