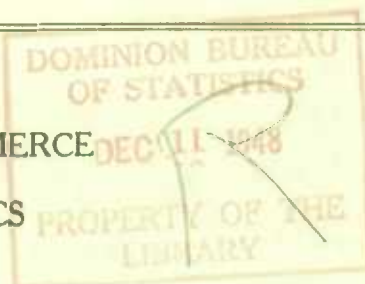

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS- DECEMBER 1, 1948

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on December 1, 1948 the stocks of creamery butter in Canada amounted to 46,758,721 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 42,498,325 lb., 3,245,396 lb. Imported and 1,015,000 lb. in transit. **There were also** 116,580 lb. Imported Butter held in bond. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 25,771,195 lb. while dairy factories held the remaining 16,727,130 lb. or 39.4 per cent. The summary total was lower than last year by 12.6 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 7.2 million lb. The five year average was 55,936,000 lb.

CHEESE The total stocks of cheese were 37,494,698 lb. consisting of 37,132,863 lb. Canadian 19,835 lb. Imported and 342,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was lower than last year by 382 thousand lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.8 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 18,121,032 lb. which was an increase of 11.7 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for November was 3.3 million lb. The chief by-product skimmilk powder, amounted to 7,560,515 lb. an increase of 1.2 million lb. over last year and a decrease of 1.4 million lb. from last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 2,311,102 lb. on December 1, and 2,579,014 lb. on November 1, 1948.

EGGS There were no cold storage eggs reported on December 1. Fresh Eggs totalled 1,179,633 dozens. Shell Eggs in transit at December 1, 1948 amounted to 252,000 dozens. Frozen Eggs totalled 8,490,251 lb. being 4.7 million lb. lower than the 1947 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement for November 1948 was 1.3 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 1.7 million pounds during November 1947.

DRESSED POULTRY The summary total of poultry stocks on December 1, 1948 was lower than last year by 13.6 million lb. An "into-storage" movement of 3.1 million pounds is shown for the month of November 1948. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,350,048 lb. fowl to 7,145,259 lb. and turkeys to 1,799,089 lb. not including estimates. There were 150,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on December 1, 1948.

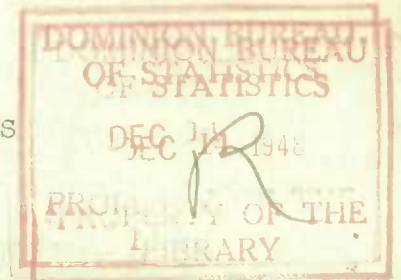
