

## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - APRIL 1, 1948

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1948 the Summary of Creamery Butter in Canada amounted to 8,189,336 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 7,699,336 lb. and 490,000 lb. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. Included in these figures were 489,000 lb. as an estimate for firms that did not report on time.

Dairy factories had in store 4,235,287 lb. or 55.0 per cent. of the holdings of Canadian made butter, while Cold Storage warehouses held the remaining 3,464,049 lb. The net"out-of-storage" movement for the month of March was 10.8 million lb. (being 58.4 per cent of the revised March 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 7.6 million lb. for March 1947.

The summary total was lower than last year by 7.2 million and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 10.7 million lb. The five year average was 11,141,000 lb.

## DAIRY BUTTER

The stocks of this commodity as reported at April 1, 1948 amounted to 4,898 lb. which was a decrease of 4,103 lb. from last year.

WHEY BUTTER There were 53,853 lb. of this product on hand on April 1, 1948 as compared with 54,077 lb. for the same month last year.

CHEESE The Summary total of cheese was 22,356,189 lt. consisting of 22,143,423 lt. Canadian (including an estimate of 296,000 lt. for firms that did not report on time) 22,766 lt. Imported and 190,000 lt. in Carloads in the hands of railway companies. There was an increase of 3.4 million lt. over the Canadian storage stocks of April 1, 1947. The net "out-of-storage" movement of Canadian cheese for March was 2.6 million lt. (being 10.5 per cent of the March 1 stock figures) as compared with a like movement of 1.3 million lt. last year.

The Summary total was higher than last year by 3.4 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.7 million lb.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 3,472,093 lb. which was a decrease of 10.5 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "into -storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for March was 921 thousand lb. The chief by-product Skimmilk Powder, amounted to 2,325,795 lb., a decrease of 91 thousand lb. from last year and a decrease of 297 thousand lb. from last month. Stocks of Frozen Cream amounted to 161,540 lb. on April 1 and 514,173 lb. on March 1, 1948.

EGGS Cold Storage Aggs came to a total of 5,041,155 dozens, Fresh Aggs totalled 3,090,496 dozens. Shell Aggs in stock were 8,131,651 dozens on April 1, 1948 compared with 6,403,914 dozens on April 1, 1947. Shell Aggs in transit at April 1, 1948 amounted to 180,000 dozens.

Frozen Eggs totalled 8,447,900 lb. being 4.5 million lb. higher than the 1947 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement of March 1948 was 81 thousand as compared with a like movement of 262 thousand lb. during March 1947.

DRESSED FOULTRY On April 1, total poultry stocks reported and estimated were 22,122,910 lb. being an increase of 5.5 million lb. over 1947 figures. Chickens in stock amounted to 7,299,097 lb. fowl to 6,632,385 lb. and turkeys to 5,233,757 lb. not including estimates. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.3 million lb. is shown for March 1948 as compared with a similar movement of 4.8 million lb. for the same month last year.

The Summary total of poultry stocks on April 1, 1948 was higher than last year by 5.5 million 1b. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.1 million 1b. is shown for the month of March 1948. There were 200,000 1b. dressed poultry in carloads on April 1, 1948.
