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# STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - JUNE 1, 1948

CREAMERY BUTTER At the opening of business on June 1, 1948 the stocks of creamery butter in Canada amounted to 11,729,745 lb., made up of Canadian make in storage 10,784,745 lb. and 945,000 lb. in transit. Dairy Factories had in store 7,846,207 lb. or 72.8 per cent, while cold storage warehouses held the remaining 2,938,538 lb. The Summary Total was lower than last year by 12.2 million lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 6.5 million lb. The five year average was 19,796,000 lb.

The total stocks of cheese were 27,159,175 lb. consisting of 27,058,988 lb. Canadian, 24,187 lb. Imported and 76,000 lb. in transit. The Summary Total was higher than last year by 369 thousand lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 5.1 million lb.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 9,386,469 lb. which was a decrease of 17.2 million lb. from last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for May was 4.3 million lb. The Chief by-product Skimmilk Powder, amounted to 6,616,747 lb., an increase of 1.3 million lb. over last year and an increase of 2.6 million lb. over last month. Stocks of frozen Cream amounted to 166,965 lb. on June 1 and 72,256 lb. on May 1, 1948.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 20,810,684 dozens, Fresh
Eggs totalled 3.105,000 dozens, Shell Eggs in stock were 23,915,684 dozens on June 1,1948
compared with 23,447,449 dozens on June 1, 1947. Shell Eggs in transit at June 1, 1948
amounted to 270,000 dozens. Frozen Eggs totalled 10,843,498 lb. being 1.1 million lb.
higher than the 1947 figures. The net "into-storage" movement of May 1948 was 1.0 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 4.0 million lb. during May 1947.

DRESSED POULTRY

The Summary total of poultry stocks on June 1, 1948 was higher than last year by 1.4 million 1b. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.5 million 1b. is shown for the month of May 1948. Chickens in stock amounted to 4,501,790 lb. fowl to 3,222,324 lb. and turkeys to 4,175,378 lb. not including estimates. There were 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on June 1, 1948.


