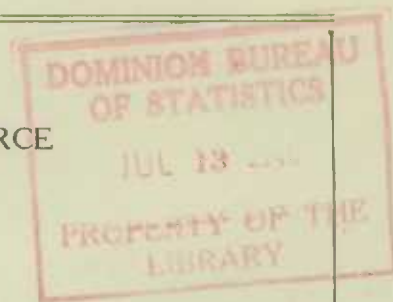

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - JULY 1, 1948

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1948 the stocks of creamery butter in Canada amounted to 30,832,397 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 30,237,397 lb. and 595,000 lb. in transit. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 16,193,247 lb., while dairy factories held the remaining 14,044,150 lb. or 46.4 per cent. The Summary Total was lower than last year by 11.8 million lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 19.1 million lb. The five year average of stocks and in transit was 40,466,000 lb.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 41,178,736 lb. consisting of 40,700,326 lb. Canadian 22,410 lb. Imported and 456,000 lb. in transit. The Summary Total was lower than last year by 762 thousand lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 14.0 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 16,394,613 lb. which was a decrease of 323 thousand lb. from last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for June was 6.7 million lb. The chief by-product Skimmilk Powder, amounted to 10,224,315 lb. an increase of 2.4 million lb. over last year and an increase of 3.5 million lb. over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 2,014,603 lb. on July 1, as compared with 204,215 lb. on June 1, 1948.

EGGS

Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 21,670,835 dozens, Fresh Eggs totalled 2,372,093 dozens, Shell Eggs in stock were 24,042,928 dozens on July 1, 1948 compared with 26,080,938 dozens on July 1, 1947. Shell Eggs in transit at July 1, 1948 amounted to 396,000 dozens. Frozen Eggs totalled 12,751,959 lb. being 1.1 million lb. lower than the 1947 figures. The net "into-storage" movement for June 1948 was 1.9 million lb. as compared with a like movement of 4.1 million lb. during June 1947.

DRESSED POULTRY

The Summary Total of poultry stocks on July 1, 1948 was lower than last year by 1.5 million lb. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.4 million lb. is shown for the month of June 1948. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,677,944 lb. fowl to 2,326,588 lb. and turkeys to 3,219,591 lb. not including estimates. There were 150,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on July 1, 1948.
