STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - SEPTEMBER 1, 1948

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on September 1, 1948 the stocks of creamery butter in Canada amounted to 50,591,503 lb. made up of Canadian make in storage 50,231.703 lb. and 359,800 lb. in transit. Cold Storage Warehouses had in store 32,178,352 lb. while dairy factories held the remaining 18,053,351 lb. The Summary Total was lower than last year by 16.5 million lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 5.7 million lb. The five year average was 68,616,000 lb.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 55,223,187 lb.

consisting of 54,754,235 lb. Canadian, 12,952 lb. Imported and 456,000 lb. in transit.

Phe Summary Total was lower than last year by 1.4 million lb. and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.9 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of Evaporated Whole Milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 26,892,450 lb. which was an increase of 5.5 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of Evaporated Whole Milk for August was 4.1 million lb. The Chief by-product Skimmilk Powder, amounted to 9,103,974 lb. an increase of 558 thousand lb. over last year and a decrease of 1.1 million lb. from last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 2,523,490 lb. on September 1 and 2,425,083 lb. on August 1, 1948.

ECG3 Cold Storage Eggs came to a total of 18,020,885 dozens Fresh Eggs totalled 2,013,347 dozens, Shell Eggs in stock were 20,034,232 dozens on September 1, 1948 compared with 25,721,619 dozens on August 1, 1947. Shell Eggs in transit at September 1, 1948 amounted to 882,000 dozens. Frozen Eggs totalled 10,780,180 lb. being 5.7 million 1b. lower than the 1947 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement for august 1948 was 832 thousand 1b. as compared with an opposite movement of 160,000 pounds during August 1947.

DRESSED POULTRY

The Summary Total of poultry stocks on September 1, 1948 was lower than last year by 7.0 million lb. An "out-of-storage" movement of 772 thousand lb. is shown for the month of August 1948. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,685,641 lb. fowl to 2,548,516 lb. and turkeys to 1,963,930 lb. not including estimates. There were 75,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on September 1, 1948.


