STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - OCTOBER 1, 1949

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1949 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 72,222,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 56,475,000 lb. while dairy factories held 15,187,000 lb. Butter in transit amounted to 560,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 18.5 million pounds. The five year average of October 1 stocks is 67,448,000 lb. The September 1949 "into-storage" movement was 5.3 million pounds as compared with a like movement of 2.6 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 36,784,000 lb. consisting of 36,395,000 lb. Canadian, 85,000 lb. imported and 304,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was lower than last year by 13.6 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 7.9 million pounds.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 56,628,000 lb. which was an increase of 29.2 million pounds over last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1949 was 1.4 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 12,956,000 lb., an increase of 3.6 million pounds over last year and an increase of 202,000 lb. over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 1,539,000 lb. on October 1, 1949

EGGS

On October 1, 1949 there were 178,000 cases of cold storage eggs, reported 40,000 cases of fresh eggs and 59,000 cases of shell eggs in transit, frozen eggs totalled 4,893,000 lb. being 5.8 million pounds lower than the 1948 figure. The net "out-of-storage" movement for September 1949 was 1,019,000 lb. as compared with a similar movement of 17,000 lb. during September 1948.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on October 1, 1949 was higher than last year by 655,000 lb. An "into-storage" movement of 3.5 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1949. Chickens in stock amounted to 3,676,000 lb. fowl to 5,299,000 lb. and turkeys to 983,000 lb. not including estimates. There were 50,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on October 1, 1949.
