### SUPPLEMENTARY REPORT - BUTTER STOCKS

In the November 10th,1949 issue of "Stocks of Dairy and Poultry Products", this Bureau published a revised figure of butter stocks for October 1. This revision was made because it was found that a few firms had not been including holdings for the Dairy Products Board in their stocks reported to the Bureau. Similar revisions for months prior to October 1 are given below. Details of these revisions will be published in the Annual Report at the end of the year, when final figures are available.

### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND FOULTRY PRODUCTS - NOVEMBER 1, 1949

### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on November 1, 1949 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 75,278,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 57,646,000 lb. while dairy factories held 17,282,000 lb. Butter in transit amounted to 350,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 21.3 million pounds. The five year average of November 1 stocks is 64 248 000 lb. The October 1949 "out-of-storage" movement was 554 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 295 thousand pounds last year.

#### CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 45,937,000 lb. consisting of 45,654,000 lb. Canadian, 55,000 lb. imported and 228,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.7 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 9.3 million pounds.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 53,549,000 lb. which was an increase of 32.1 million pounds over last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October 1949 was 3.1 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 12,182,000 lb., an increase of 3.2 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 782,000 lb. from last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 1,497,000 lb. on November 1, 1949.

#### EGGS

On November 1, 1949 there were 9,000 cases of cold storage eggs reported, 29,000 cases of fresh eggs and 19,000 cases of shell eggs in transit frozen eggs totalled 4,165,000 lb. being 5.6 million pounds lower than the 1948 figure. The net "out-of-storage" movement for October 1949 was 890,000 lb. as compared with a similar movement of 965,000 lb. during October 1948.

#### DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on November 1, 1949 was higher than last year by 2,155,000 lb. An "into-storage" movement of 4.9 million pounds is shown for the month of October 1949. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,704,000 lb. fowl to 7,981,000 lb. and turkeys to 990,000 lb. not including estimates. There were 150,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on November 1, 1949.
