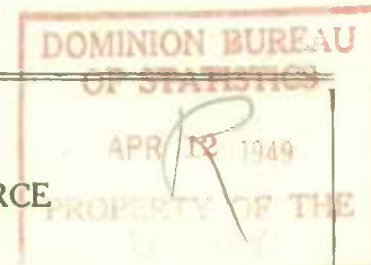

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS  
APRIL 1, 1949

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1949 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 12,691,000 lb. Cold storage warehouses had in store 5,508,000 lb. while dairy factories held 6,718,000 lb. Butter in transit amounted to 465,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 4.3 million pounds. The five year average of April 1 stocks is 10,827,000 lb. The March 1949 "out-of-storage" movement was 6.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.6 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 24,440,000 lb. consisting of 24,261,000 pounds canadian 27,000 lb. imported and 152,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was higher than last year by 1.9 million lb. and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.4 million lb.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 15,268,000 lb. which was an increase of 11.8 million lb. over last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March, 1949 was 2.6 million lb. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 7,352,000 pounds an increase of 5.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 679 thousand pounds over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 571,000 lb. on April 1, 1949 and 1,004,000 lb. on March 1, 1949.

EGGS

There were 316,000 cases of cold storage eggs reported on April 1, 1949. Fresh eggs totalled 80,000 cases, shell eggs in transit at April 1, 1949 amounted to 3,000 cases. Frozen eggs totalled 6,411,000 lb. being 2.2 million lb. lower than the 1948 figures. The net "out-of-storage" movement for March 1949 was 123 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 20 thousand pounds during March 1948.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on April 1, 1949 was lower than last year by 13.5 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.9 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1949. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,699,000 lb. fowl to 2,329,000 lb. and turkeys to 2,514,000 lb. not including estimates. There were 100,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on April 1, 1949.

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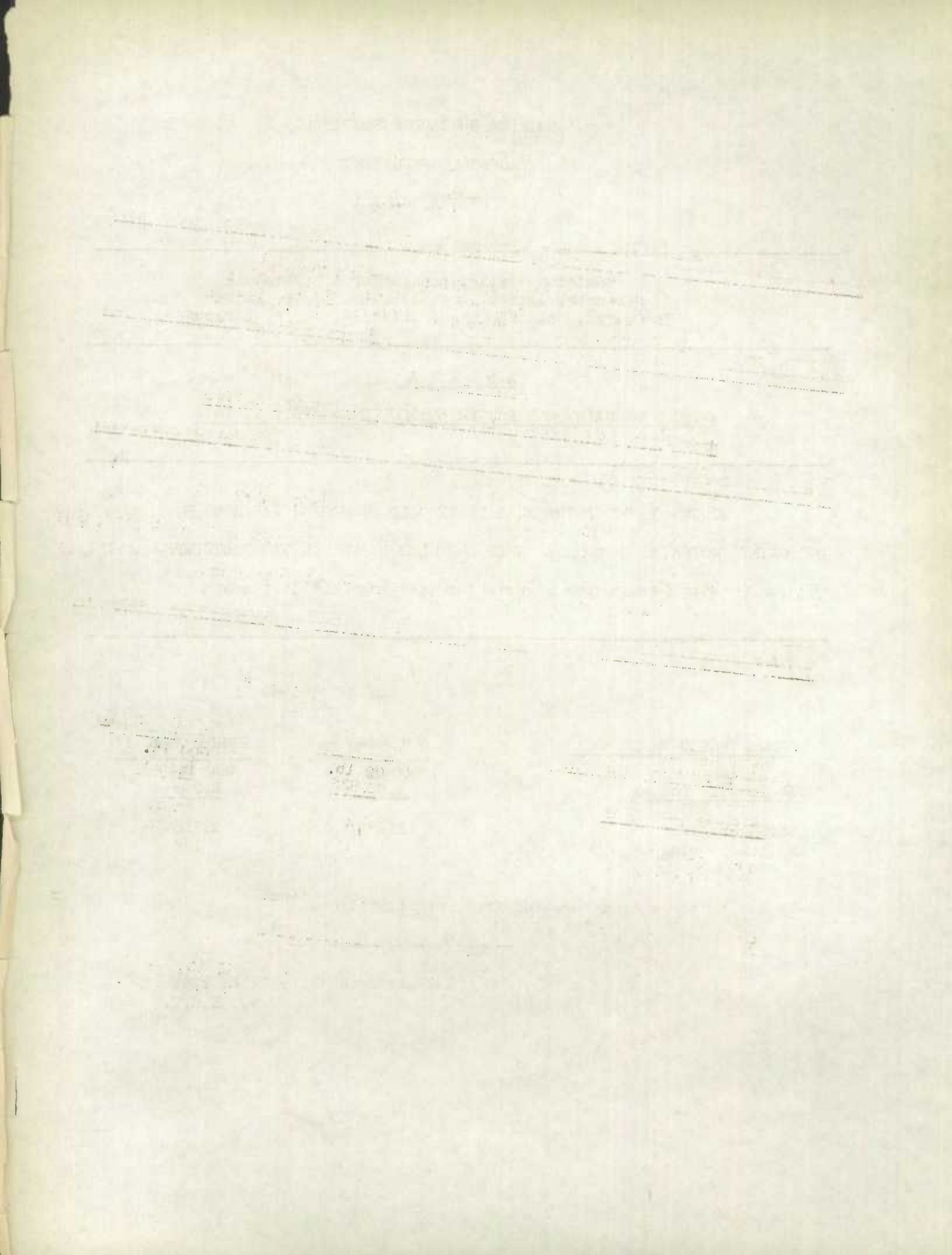
