

### STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS, JUNE 1, 1949

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on June 1, 1949 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 23,648,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 12,322,000 lb. while dairy factories held 10,976,000 lb. Butter in transit amounted to 350,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 11.8 million pounds. The five year average of June 1 stocks is 18,205,000 lb. The May 1949 "into-storage" movement was 10.2 million pounds as compared with a like movement of 6.5 million pounds last year.

#### CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 29,225,000 lb. consisting of 28,964,000 lb. Canadian 109,000 lb. imported and 152,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was higher than last year by 1.8 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 5.5 million pounds.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 29,163,000 lb. which was an increase of 19.5 million pounds over last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May 1949 was 10.1 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 13,235,000 lb. an increase of 6.4 million pounds over last year and an increase of 3.3 million pounds over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 182,000 lb. on June 1, 1949.

#### EGGS

On June 1, 1949 there were 581,000 cases of cold storage eggs reported, 82,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,803,000 lb. being 4.0 million pounds lower than the 1948 figure. The net "out-of-storage" movement for May 1949 was 373,000 lb. as compared with an opposite movement of 979,000 lb. during May 1948.

#### DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on June 1, 1949 was lower than last year by 7.6 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 629,000 lb. is shown for the month of May 1949. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,516,000 lb. fowl to 1,346,000 lb. and turkeys to 1,918,000 lb. not including estimates. There were no stocks of dressed poultry in transit on June 1, 1949.
