STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS- AUGUST 1, 1949

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on August 1, 1949 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 56,668,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 42,239,000 lb. while dairy factories held 13,939,000 lb. Butter in transit amounted to 490,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 11.6 million pounds. The five year average of August 1 stocks is 54,627,000 lb. The July 1949 "into-storage" movement was 14.4 million pounds as compared with a like movement of 14.7 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 29,717,000 lb. consisting of 29,273,000 lb. Canadian 102,000 lb. imported and 342,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was lower than last year by 21.8 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.4 million pounds.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 54,032,000 lb. which was an increase of 31.2 million pounds over last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for July 1949 was 7.0 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 12,221,000 lb. an increase of 2.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 1.3 million pounds over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 669,000 lb. on August 1, 1949.

EGGS

On August 1, 1949 there were 599,000 cases of cold storage eggs reported 44,000 cases of fresh eggs and 6,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,648,000 lb. being 5.0 million pounds lower than the 1948 figure. The net "out-of-storage" movement for July 1949 was 623,000 lb. as compared with a similar movement of 1,100,000 lb. during July 1948.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on August 1, 1949 was lower than last year by 2.4 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 601,000 lb. is shown for the month of July 1949. Chickens in stock amounted to 1,949,000 lb. fowl to 2,177,000 lb. and turkeys to 1,611,000 lb. not including estimates. There were no stocks of dressed poultry in transit on August 1, 1949.
