



- STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - OCTOBER 1, 1951

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1951 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 62,069,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 42,966,000 lb. while dairy factories held 18,393,000 pounds. Butter in transit amounted to 710,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 8.2 million pounds. The five year average of October 1 stocks is 69,015,000 lb. The September 1951 "into-storage" movement was 6.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 2.2 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 44,848,000 lb. consisting of 40,352,000 lb. Canadian, 4,078,000 lb. Imported and 418,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.6 million pounds and showed a net "into-storage" movement of 4.0 million pounds for Setpember 1951.

CONCENTRATED MILK FRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 60,140,000 lb. which was a increase of 34.0 million pounds over last year. The apparent net "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1951 was 496 thousand pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 9,880,000 lb. an increase of 3.6 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 87 thousand pounds from last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 1,871,000 lb. on October 1, 1951. Ice Cream stocks amounted to 782,000 gallons as compared with 762,000 gallons on October 1, 1950.

EGGS

The October 1, 1951 report shows 77,000 cases of cold storage eggs 48,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,374,000 being 3.6 million pounds lower than the 1950 figure. The net "out-of-storage" movement for September 1951 was 494 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 720 thousand pounds during September 1950.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on October 1, 1951 was higher than last year by 6.6 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 4.3 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1951. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,045,000 pounds fowl to 8,002,000 lb. and turkeys 1,119,000 lb. not including estimates. There were 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit and imports amounted to 264,000 lb. on October 1, 1951.
