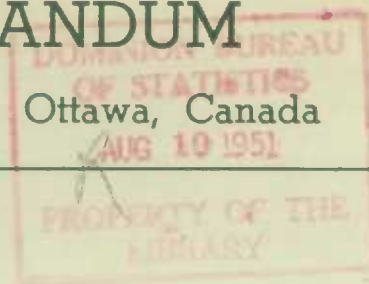

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - AUGUST 1, 1951

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on August 1, 1951 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 45,568,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 28,895,000 lb. while dairy factories held 16,218,000 lb. Butter in transit amounted to 455,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 15.1 million pounds. The five year average of August 1 stocks is 56,633,000 lb. The July 1951 "into-storage" movement was 13.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.3 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

The total stocks of cheese were 36,732,000 lb. consisting of 35,595,000 lb. Canadian 187,000 lb. Imported and 950,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was higher than last year by 110 thousand pounds and showed a net "into-storage" movement of 9.5 million pounds for July 1951.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 55,338,000 lb. which was an increase of 18.3 million pounds over last year. The apparent net "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for July 1951 was 19.1 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 8,359,000 lb. an increase of 342 thousand pounds over last year and an increase of 1.9 million pounds over last month. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 1,260,000 lb. on August 1, 1951. Ice Cream stocks amounted to 887,000 gallons as compared with 932,000 gallons on August 1, 1950.

EGGS

The August 1, 1951 report shows 155,000 cases of cold storage eggs 61,000 cases of fresh eggs and 4,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,083,000 being 4.5 million pounds lower than the 1950 figure. The net "into-storage" movement for July 1951 was 918 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 199 thousand pounds during July 1950.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on August 1, 1951 was lower than last year by 882 thousand pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 215 thousand pounds is shown for the month of July 1951. Chickens in stock amounted to 2,711,000 pounds fowl to 2,430,000 lb. and turkeys 1,547,000 lb. not including estimates. There were 75,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on August 1, 1951.
