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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - DECEMBER 1, 1954 1.

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on December 1, 1954 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 103,792,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 84,401,000 lb. while dairy factories held 19,181,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 21.3 million pounds. The five year average of December 1 stocks is 64,904,000 lb. The November 1954 "out-of-storage" movement was 10.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.4 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 46,350,000 lb. consisting of 46,035,000 lb. Canadian, 11,000 lb. imported and 304,000 lb. in transit on December 1, 1954. The summary total was higher than last year by 10.4 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 2.3 million pounds for November 1954.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 49,108,000 lb. which was a decrease of 1.5 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November 1954 was 10.7 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 13,730,000 lb. an increase of 2.1 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 3.4 million pounds from last month. Ice cream stocks amounted to 953,000 gallons as compared with 847,000 gallons on December 1, 1953. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 377,000 lb. on December 1, 1954, last year they amounted to 630,000 lb.

EGGS

The December 1, 1954 report shows 107,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 49,000 cases of fresh eggs. There were no shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,200,000 lb. being 268 thousand pounds higher than the 1953 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for November 1954 was 1.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 948 thousand pounds during November 1953.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on December 1, 1954 was lower than last year by 1.6 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 9.9 million pounds is shown for the month of November 1954. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,461,000 lb., fowl to 6,395,000 lb. and turkeys to 9,560,000 lb., not including estimates. There were 600,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on December 1, 1954.
