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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1954 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 42,277,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 34,769,000 lb. while dairy factories held 7,438,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 15.5 million pounds. The five year average of April 1 stocks is 18,920,000 lb. The March 1954 "out-of-storage" movement was 8.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 6.8 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 22,397,000 lb. consisting of 22,153,000 lb. Canadian, 16,000 lb. imported and 228,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was lower than last year by 4.2 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.5 million pounds for March 1954.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 16,989,000 lb. which was a decrease of 6.0 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1954 was 4.6 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 6,767,000 lb. a decrease of 5.8 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 1.4 million pounds from last month. Ice cream stocks amounted to 976,000 gallons as compared with 817,000 gallons on April 1, 1953. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 77,000 lb. on April 1, 1954, last year they amounted to 316,000 lb.

EGGS

The April 1, 1954 report shows 159,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 78,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 4,606,000 lb. being 215 thousand pounds higher than the 1953 figures. The "into-storage" movement for March 1954 was 531 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 300 thousand pounds during March 1953.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on April 1, 1954 was higher than last year by 10.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.5 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1954. Chickens in stock amounted to 8,417,000 lb., fowl to 5,666,000 lb. and turkeys to 5,474,000 lb., not including estimates. There were 50,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on April 1, 1954.
