SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - JUNE 1, 1954

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on June 1, 1954 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 52,285,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 39,362,000 lb. while dairy factories held 12,783,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 14.7 million pounds. The five year average of June 1 stocks is 27,255,000 lb. The May 1954 "into-storage" movement was 9.4 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 10.6 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 24,925,000 lb. consisting of 24,735,000 lb. Canadian and 190,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was lower than last year by 5.1 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 2.7 million pounds for May 1954.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 31,469,000 lb. which was a decrease of 8.1 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for May 1954 was 12.8 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 10,248,000 lb. a decrease of 1.5 million pounds from last year and an increase of 2.6 million pounds over last month. Ice cream stocks amounted to 1,215,000 gallons as compared with 1,125,000 gallons on June 1, 1953. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 123,000 lb. on June 1, 1954, last year they amounted to 286,000 lb.

EGGS

The June 1, 1954 reports shows 249,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 76,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,280,000 lb. being 370 thousand pounds higher than the 1953 figures. The "into-storage" movement for May 1954 was 1.2 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 876 thousand pounds during May 1953.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on June 1, 1954 was higher than last year by 8.6 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 2.3 million pounds is shown for the month of May 1954. Chickens in stock amounted to 6,196,000 lb., fowl to 4,251,000 lb. and turkeys to 4,050,000 lb., not including estimates. There were 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on June 1, 1954.
