Memorandum

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - JULY 1, 1954

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1954 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 74,162,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 56,846,000 lb. while dairy factories held 17,176,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 13.6 million pounds. The five year average of July 1 stocks is 46,153,000 lb. The June 1954 "into-storage" movement was 22.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 22.9 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 33,608,000 lb. consisting of 33,338,000 lb. Canadian 4,000 lb. imported and 266,000 lb. in transit. The summary total was lower than last year by 2.6 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 8.7 million pounds for June 1954.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 48,950,000 lb. which was a decrease of 5.8 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June 1954 was 17.5 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 14,233,000 lb. an increase of 368 thousand pounds over last year and an increase of 4.1 million pounds over last month. Ice cream stocks amounted to 1,293,000 gallons as compared with 1,078,000 gallons on July 1, 1953. Stocks of frozen cream amounted to 330,000 lb. on July 1, 1954, last year they amounted to 569,000 lb.

EGGS

The July 1, 1954 report shows 247,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 64,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases of shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,355,000 lb. being 39 thousand pounds higher than the 1953 figures. The "into-storage" movement for June 1954 was 1.1 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.5 million pounds during June 1953.

DRESSED POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on July 1, 1954 was higher than last year by 7.5 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 1.7 million pounds is shown for the month of June 1954. Chickens in stock amounted to 5,536,000 lb., fowl to 3,909,000 lb. and turkeys to 3,662,000 lb., not including estimates. There were 25,000 lb. dressed poultry in transit on July 1, 1954.
