

#### SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1956 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 121,614,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 88,455,000 lb. while dairy factories held 33,089,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 4.9 million pounds. The five year average 1951-55 of October 1 stocks is 95,208,000 lb. The September 1956 "into-storage" movement was 5.8 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 8.0 million pounds last year.

#### CHEDDAR CHERSE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 44,742,000 lb. consisting of 44,517,000 lb. Canadian, 225,000 lb. imported. There was no cheese in transit on October 1, 1956. The summary total was lower than last year by 1.4 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.7 million pounds for September 1956.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 62,063,000 lb. which was a decrease of 450 thousand pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1956 was 410 thousand pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 14,414,000 lb. an increase of 2.6 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 277 thousand pounds from last month. Ice Cream stocks amounted to 1,151,000 gallons as compared with 1,255,000 gallons on October 1, 1955.

#### EGGS

The October 1, 1956 report shows 30,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 56,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,343,000 lb. being 2.8 million pounds lower than the 1955 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September 1956 was 95 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 816 thousand pounds during September 1955.

#### POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on October 1, 1956 was higher than last year by 3.2 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 3.2 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1956. By kinds, with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 2,470,000 lb. (979,000) lb., Fowl 4,340,000 lb. (1,555,000) lb. and turkey 1,566,000 lb. (1,792,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry in transit on October 1, 1956.
