

#### SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on December 1, 1956 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 105,423,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 77,359,000 lb. while dairy factories held 27,935,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 8.2 million pounds. The five year average 1951-55 of December 1 stocks is 84,394,000 lb. The November 1956 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 14.3 million pounds last year.

#### CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 41,732,000 lb. consisting of 41,386,000 lb. Canadian, 156,000 lb. imported and 190,000 lb. in transit on December 1, 1956. The summary total was higher than last year by 830 thousand pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.4 million pounds for November 1956.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 45,694,000 lb. which was a decrease of 1.9 million pounds last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for November 1956 was 11.5 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 9,156,000 lb. a decrease of 4.2 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 3.2 million pounds from last month. Ice Cream stocks amounted to 1,110,000 gallons as compared with 1,130,000 gallons on December 1, 1955.

#### EGGS

The December 1, 1956 report shows 14,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 61,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,345,000 lb. being 1.6 million pounds lower than the 1955 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for Movember 1956 was 641 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.3 million pounds during November 1955.

#### POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on December 1, 1956 was higher than last year by 14.0 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 17.1 million pounds is shown for the month of November 1956. By kinds, with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 6,155,000 lb. (3,442,000) lb., Fowl 7,657,000 lb. (4,145,000) lb. and turkey 6,184,000 lb. (11,607,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 600,000 lb. of poultry in transit on December 1, 1956.
