

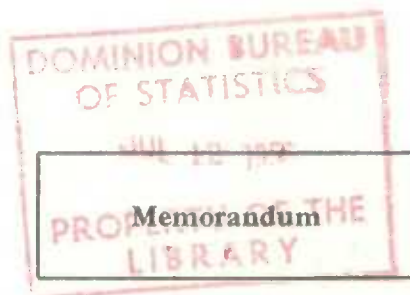

STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

JULY, 1956



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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1956 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 89,729,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 62,712,000 lb. while dairy factories held 26,912,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 551 thousand pounds. The five year average 1951-55 of July 1 stocks is 60,444,000 lb. The June 1956 "into-storage" movement was 20.3 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 22.2 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 32,444,000 lb. consisting of 31,789,000 lb. Canadian, 541,000 lb. imported and 114,000 lb. in transit on July 1, 1956. The summary total was lower than last year by 4.8 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 5.0 million pounds for June 1956.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 40,505,000 lb. which was an increase of 1.5 million pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June 1956 was 15.5 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 14,688,000 lb. an increase of 5.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 3.0 million pounds over last month. Ice Cream stocks amounted to 1,419,000 gallons as compared with 1,382,000 gallons on July 1, 1955.

EGGS

The July 1, 1956 report shows 74,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 64,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,826,000 lb. being 3.3 million pounds lower than the 1955 figures. The "into-storage" movement for June 1956 was 1.3 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 735 thousand pounds during June 1955.

POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on July 1, 1956 was higher than last year by 1.8 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 1.6 million pounds is shown for the month of June 1956. By kinds, with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 2,010,000 lb. (911,000) lb., Fowl 1,615,000 lb. (729,000) lb. and turkey 2,634,000 lb. (1,513,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry in transit on July 1, 1956.
