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

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on September 1, 1956 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 115,867,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 83,884,000 lb. while dairy factories held 31,843,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 2.7 million pounds. The five year average 1951-55 of September 1 stocks is 88,417,000 lb. The August 1956 "into-storage" movement was 10.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 12.2 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 40,602,000 lb. consisting of 40,319,000 lb. Canadian, 207,000 lb. imported and 76,000 lb. in transit on September 1, 1956. The summary total was lower than last year by 2.3 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 3.9 million pounds for August 1956.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 62,473,000 lb. which was an increase of 6.1 million pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for August 1956 was 6.2 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 14,678,000 lb. an increase of 4.8 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 261 thousand pounds from last month. Ice Cream stocks amounted to 1,367,000 gallons as compared with 1,408,000 gallons on September 1, 1955.

EGGS

The September 1, 1956 report shows 52,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 50,000 cases of fresh eggs and 4,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,439,000 lb. being 3.5 million pounds lower than the 1955 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for August 1956 was 379 thousand pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 187,000 thousand pounds during August 1955.

POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on September 1, 1956 was higher than last year by 3.2 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 2.0 million pounds is shown for the month of August 1956. By kinds, with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 2,162,000 lb. (845,000) lb., Fowl 3,048,000 lb. (1,279,000) lb. and turkey 1,611,000 lb. (1,221,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry in transit on September 1, 1956.
