
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# STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS

MARCH, 1957

#### SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on March 1, 1957 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 58,045,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 40,564,000 lb. while dairy factories held 17,411,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 17.0 million pounds. The five year average 1952-56 of March 1 stocks is 50,782,000 lb. The February 1957 "out-of-storage" movement was 14.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 13.3 million pounds last year.

#### CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 32,051,000 lb. consisting of 31,631,000 lb. Canadian, 306,000 lb. imported and 114,000 lb. in transit on March 1, 1957. The summary total was higher than last year by 631 thousand pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.1 million pounds for February 1957.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 18,289,000 lb. which was a decrease of 4.7 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for February 1957 was 6.6 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 4,392,000 lb. a decrease of 7.8 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 1.6 million pounds from last month.

Ice Cream stocks amounted to 1,086,000 gallons as compared with 1,011,000 gallons on March 1, 1956.

#### EGGS

The March 1, 1957 report shows 206,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 62,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,330,000 lb. being 808 thousand pounds higher than the 1956 figures. The "into-storage" movement for February 1957 was 289 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 87 thousand pounds during February 1957.

#### POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on March 1, 1957 was higher than last year by 14.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 4.6 million pounds is shown for the month of February 1957. By kinds, with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 6,316,000 lb. (3,950,000) lb., Fowl 6,007,000 lb. 4,339,000 lb. and turkey 6,798,000 lb. (8,074,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There was no poultry in transit on March 1, 1957.

These average weights are in accordance with order of Transport Controller TCO4F.

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
