

SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1957 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 57,002,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 23,426,000 lb. while dairy factories held 13,471,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 26.7 million pounds. The five year average 1952-56 of May 1 stocks is 41,882,000 lb. The April 1957 "out-of-storage" movement was 6.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.3 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 28,634,000 lb. consisting of 28,453,000 lb. Canadian, 105,000 lb. imported and 76,000 lb. in transit on May 1, 1957. The summary total was higher than last year by 2.0 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 131 thousand pounds for April 1957.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 12,412,000 lb. which was a decrease of 6.8 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April 1957 was 132 thousand pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 4,710,000 lb. a decrease of 6.5 million pounds from last year and an increase of 1.4 million pounds over last month.

EGGS

The May 1, 1957 report shows 312,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 71,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,893,000 lb. being 2.6 million pounds higher than the 1956 figures. The "out-of-storage" mevement for April 1957 was 293 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 927 thousand pounds during April 1956.

POULTRY

The summary total of poultry stocks on May 1, 1957 was higher than last year by 11.5 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 5.9 million pounds is shown for the month of April 1957. By kinds, with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 3,889,000 lb. (2,615,000) lb., Fowl 4,476,000 lb. (3,956,000) lb. and turkey 4,995,000 lb. (5,280,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were no stocks of poultry in transit on May 1, 1957.




