

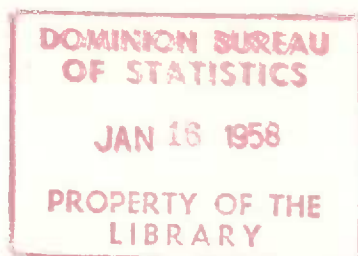

SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1958 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 69,899,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 45,242,000 lb. while dairy factories held 24,552,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 18.3 million pounds. The five year average 1953-57 of January 1 stocks is 79,719,000. The December 1957 "out-of-storage" movement was 11.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 16.6 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 51,367,000 lb. consisting of 51,202,000 lb. Canadian, 13,000 lb. imported and 152,000 lb. in transit on January 1, 1958. The summary total was higher than last year by 11.7 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 3.8 million pounds for December 1957.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 47,846,000 lb. which was an increase of 9.8 million pounds over last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1957 was 10.5 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 47,941,000 lb. an increase of 40.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 4.5 million pounds over last month.

EGGS

The January 1, 1958 report shows 3,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 87,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 13,365,000 lb. being 8.2 million pounds higher than the 1957 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December 1957 was 1.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 200 thousand pounds during December 1956.

POULTRY

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry stocks on January 1, 1958 was lower than last year by 8.1 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 11.4 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1957. By kinds with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 2,681,000 lb. (3,477,000) lb., Fowl 6,917,000 lb. (7,260,000) lb. and turkey 2,275,000 lb. (8,535,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were no stocks of poultry in transit on January 1, 1958.

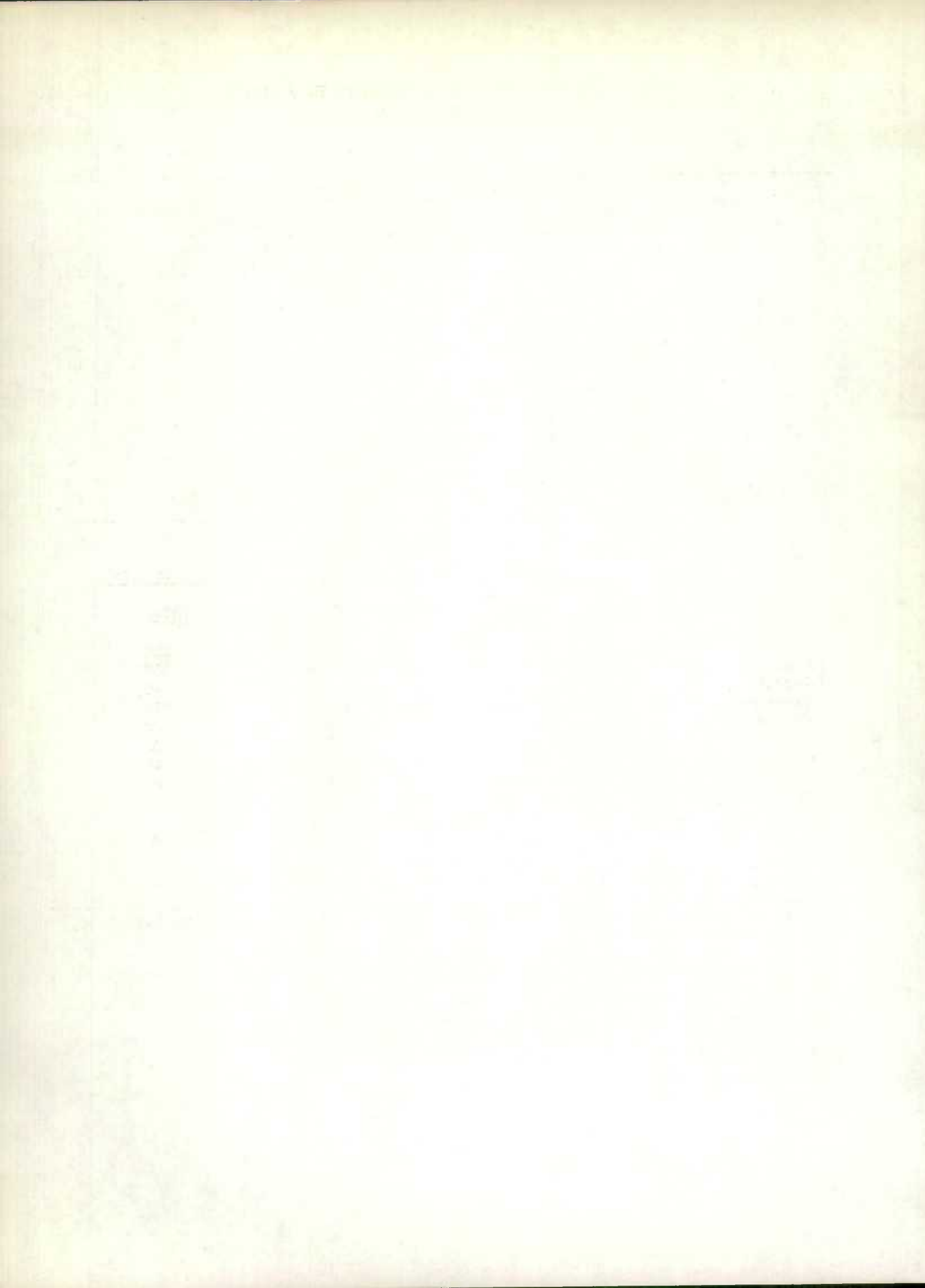
