

#### SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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#### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on May 1, 1958 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 35,160,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 20,782,000 lb. while dairy factories held 14,133,000 lb. The summary total was lower than last year by 1.7 million pounds. The five year average 1953-57 of May 1 stocks is 45,828,000 lb. The April 1958 "out-of-storage" movement was 2.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 7.1 million pounds last year.

#### CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 40,648,000 lb. consisting of 40,529,000 lb. Canadian, 5,000 lb. imported and 114,000 lb. in transit on May 1, 1958. The summary total was higher than last year by 12.5 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 539 thousand pounds for April 1958.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 28,145,000 lb. which was an increase of 15.7 million pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for April 1958 was 6.0 million pounds. The chief by-product skimmilk powder amounted to 39,756,000 lb. an increase of 35.0 million pounds over last year and an increase of 939 thousand pounds over last month.

#### EGGS

The May 1, 1958 report shows 121,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 81,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,948,000 lb. being 796 thousand pounds higher than the 1957 figures. The "Out-of-storage" movement for April 1958 was 4.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 35 thousand pounds during April 1957.

#### POULTRY

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry stocks on May 1, 1958 was lower than last year by 9.5 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 5.3 million pounds is shown for the month of April 1958. By kinds with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks include: Chicken 1,350,000 lb. (1,372,000) lb., Fowl 2,360,000 lb. (5,874,000) lb. and turkey 899,000 lb. (4,965,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry in transit on May 1, 1958.


