

SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - September 1, 1958

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on September 1, 1958 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 100,987,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 67,861,000 lb. while dairy factories held 33,056,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 17.8 million pounds. The five year average 1953-57 of September 1 stocks is 102,834,000 lb. The August 1958 "into-storage" movement was 15.0 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.5 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 57,383,000 lb. consisting of 57,345,000 lb. Canadian and 38,000 lb. in transit, there were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on September 1, 1958. The summary total was higher than last year by 1.5 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 2.8 million pounds for August 1958.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 80,559,000 lb. which was an increase of 8 thousand pounds over last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for August 1958 was 4.3 million pounds. The chief by-product skim-milk powder amounted to 73,945,000 lb. an increase of 46.6 million pounds over last year and an increase of 14.7 million pounds over last month.

EGGS

The September 1, 1958 report shows 125,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 44,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 10,811,000 lb. being 4.1 million pounds lower than the 1957 figures. The "into-storage" movement for August 1958 was 389 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.0 million pounds during August 1957.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on September 1, 1958 was lower than last year by 4.7 million pounds. An "into storage" movement of 3.7 million pounds is shown for the month of August 1958. By kinds with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets, these stocks included: Chicken 956,000 lb. (2,161,000) lb., Fowl 1,603,000 lb. (4,749,000) lb. and turkey 382,000 lb. (3,278,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 25,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on September 1, 1958.
