SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

CREA ERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on January 1, 1959 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 93,731,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 66,942,000 lb. while dairy factories held 26,719,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 23.8 million pounds. The five year average 1954-58 of January 1 stocks is 84,191,000 lb. The December 1958 "out-of-storage" movement was 12.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 11.8 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 46,353,000 lb. consisting of 46,201,000 lb. Canadian and 152,000 lb. in transit, there were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on January 1, 1959. The summary total was lower than last year by 5.7 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 5.5 million pounds for December 1959.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 47,781,000 lb. which was a decrease of 97 thousand pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for December 1958 was 9.1 million pounds. The chief by-products skimmilk powder amounted to 77,234,000 lb. an increase of 29.4 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 9.3 million pounds from last month.

EGGS

The January 1, 1959 report shows 20,000 cases of cold storage eggs 81,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 6,166,000 lb. being 7.2 million pounds lower than the 1958 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for December 1958 was 860 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.1 million pounds during December 1957.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on January 1, 1959 was higher than last year by 10.9 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 16.1 million pounds is shown for the month of December 1958. By kinds with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets these stocks include: Chicken 3,696,000 lb. (9,420,000) lb. Fowl 3,497,000 lb. (9,214,000) lb. and turkey 2,003,000 lb. (15,886,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on January 1, 1959.
