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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - October 1, 1959

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on October 1, 1959 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 133,840,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 96,008,000 lb. while dairy factories held 37,482,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 22.4 million pounds. The five year average 1954-58 of October 1 stocks is 113,004,000 lb. The September 1959 "into-storage" movement was 8.9 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.6 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 56,561,000 lb. consisting of 56,371,000 lb. Canadian and 190,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on October 1, 1959. The summary total was lower than last year by 4.8 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 6.3 million pounds for September 1959.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 66,853,000 lb. which was a decrease of 10.3 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for September 1959 was 3.5 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim-milk powder, amounted to 51,178,000 lb., a decrease of 35.7 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 4.5 million pounds from last month.

EGGS

The October 1, 1959 report shows 82,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 38,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 8,308,000 lb. being 2.4 million pounds lower than the 1958 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for September 1959 was 1.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 102 thousand pounds during September 1958.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on October 1, 1959 was lower than last year by 793 thousand pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 6.8 million pounds is shown for the month of September 1959. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were; Chicken 1,296,000 lb. (2,870,000) lb., Fowl 2,004,000 lb. (4,147,000) lb. and turkey 833,000 lb. (10,715,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 425,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on October 1, 1959.
