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## SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - November 1, 1959

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on November 1, 1959 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 132,211,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 94,970,000 lb. while dairy factories held 36,887,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 18.3 million pounds. The five year average 1954-58 of November 1 stocks is 112,616,000 lb. The October 1959 "out-of-storage" movement was 1.6 million pounds as compared with an opposite movement of 2.4 million pounds last year.

CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 55,881,000 lb. consisting of 55,691,000 lb. Canadian and 190,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on November 1, 1959. The summary total was lower than last year by 5.0 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 432 thousand pounds for October 1959.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 65,716,000 lb. which was a decrease of 1.7 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for October 1959 was 1.1 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim-milk powder, amounted to 34,511,000 lb., a decrease of 63.8 million pounds from last year and a decrease of 16.8 million pounds from last month.

EGGS

The November 1, 1959 report shows 41,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 34,000 cases of fresh eggs and 2,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 7,730,000 lb. being 1.8 million pounds lower than the 1958 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for October 1959 was 660 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.2 million pounds during October 1958.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on November 1, 1959 was lower than last year by 8.2 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 9.9 million pounds is shown for the month of October 1959. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were; Chicken 1,326,000 lb. (3,688,000) lb., Fowl 2,460,000 lb. (4,796,000) lb. and turkey 1,023,000 lb. (17,918,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 125,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on November 1, 1959.
