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

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SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - April 1, 1959

CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on April 1, 1959 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 61,715,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 45,825,000 lb. while dairy factories held 15,680,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 24.5 million pounds. The five year average 1954-58 of April 1 stocks is 49,468,000 lb. The March 1959 "out-of-storage" movement was 9.3 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 9.5 million pounds last year.

CHEESE

Stocks of Canadian cheddar cheese were 33,748,000 lb. on April 1, 1959. There were no imported cheddar or in transit stocks reported. These figures were lower than last year by 7.6 million pounds and showed an "out-of-storage" movement of 4.7 million pounds for March 1959.

CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 19,671,000 lb. which was a decrease of 2.5 million pounds from last year. The "out-of-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for March 1959 was 6.3 million pounds. The chief by-products skim-milk powder amounted to 70,424,000 lb. an increase of 31.8 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 699 thousand pounds from last month.

EGGS

The April 1, 1959 report shows 209,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 67,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 5,560,000 lb. being 6.8 million pounds lower than the 1958 figures. The "out-of-storage" movement for March 1959 was 26 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 783 thousand pounds during March 1958.

POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on April 1, 1959 was higher than last year by 9.3 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 7.4 million pounds is shown for the month of March 1959. By kinds with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets these stocks include: Chicken 3,239,000 lb. (6,346,000) lb., Fowl 1,723,000 lb. (6,457,000) lb. and turkey 1,854,000 lb. (11,028,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were no stocks of poultry meat in transit on April 1, 1959.
