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## SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

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## STOCKS OF DAIRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS - July 1, 1959

### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on July 1, 1959 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 93,203,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 65,020,000 lb. while dairy factories held 27,903,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 26.0 million pounds. The five year average 1954-58 of July 1 stocks is 76,093,000 lb. The June 1959 "into-storage" movement was 21.6 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 22.5 million pounds last year.

### CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 40,086,000 lb. consisting of 40,010,000 lb. Canadian and 76,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on July 1, 1959. The summary total was lower than last year by 8.7 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 4.9 million pounds for June 1959.

### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 48,381,000 lb. which was a decrease of 13.0 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for June 1959 was 15.6 million pounds. The chief by-products skim-milk powder amounted to 65,081,000 lb. an increase of 11.9 million pounds over last year and an increase of 37 thousand pounds over last month.

### EGGS

The July 1, 1959 report shows 304,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 73,000 cases of fresh eggs and 4,000 cases shell eggs in transit. Frozen eggs totalled 9,427,000 lb. being 344,000 thousand pounds higher than the 1958 figures. The "into-storage" movement for June 1959 was 1.5 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 1.4 million pounds during June 1958.

### POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on July 1, 1959 was higher than last year by 8.1 million pounds. An "out-of-storage" movement of 3.9 million pounds is shown for the month of June 1959. By kinds with reported eviscerated quantity in brackets these stocks include: Chicken 1,682,000 lb. (3,120,000) lb., Fowl 1,488,000 lb. (3,719,000) lb. and turkey 1,209,000 lb. (6,532,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 75,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on July 1, 1959.

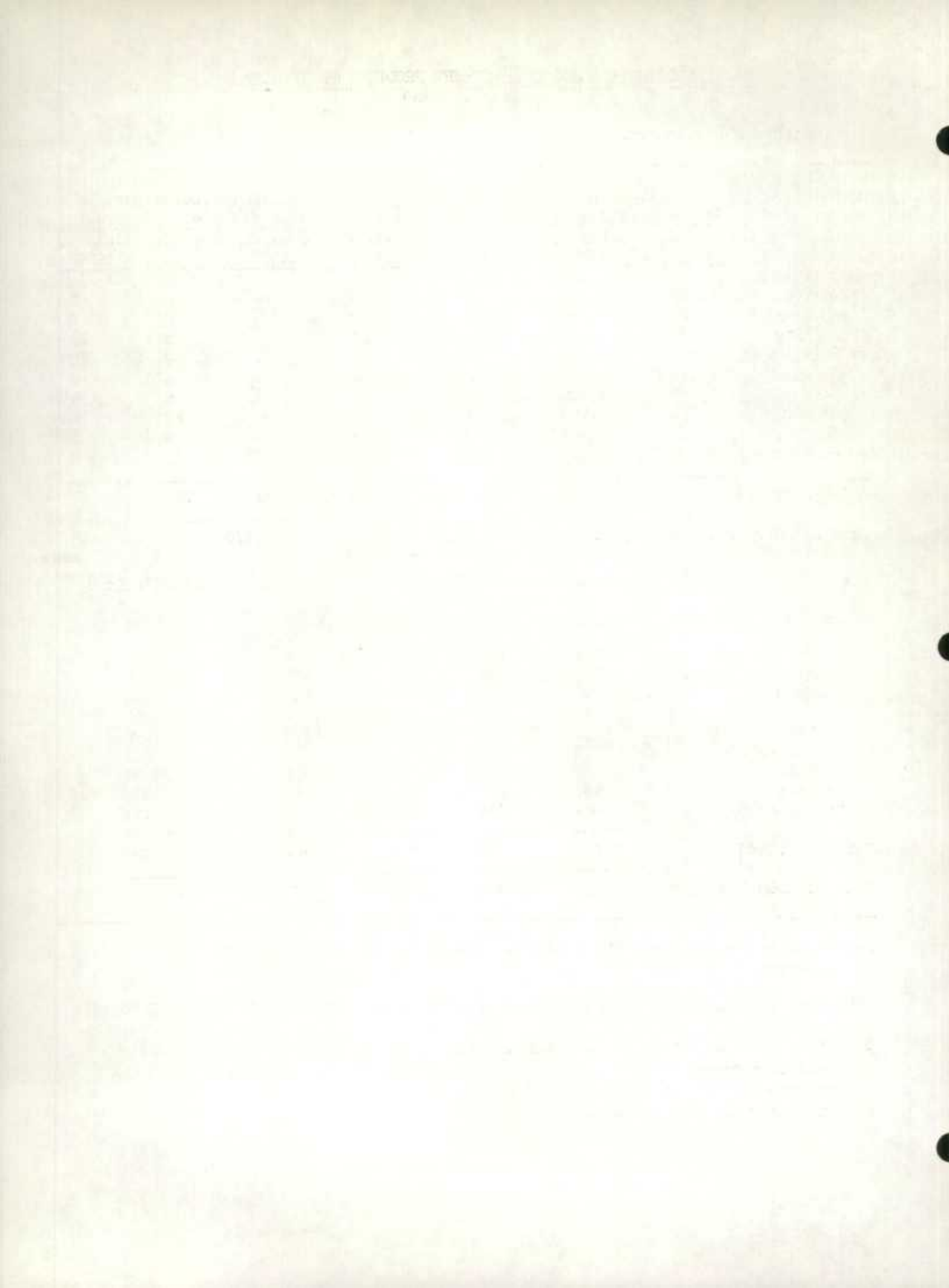
