### SOURCE AND CONTENT

Data for this report are collected by mail questionnaires from dairy factories, concentrated milk manufacturers, public and semi public cold storages, meat packers, wholesale grocers' warehouses and central warehouses of chain grocery stores.

Inventories are taken at manufacturers and wholesale level and firms are required to report all stocks held in their own establishments or in specially rented rooms elsewhere as at the opening of the first business day of the month.

Stocks of butter and cheese in dairy factories are obtained with the co-operation of the provincial governments.

### CREAMERY BUTTER

At the opening of business on September 1, 1959 the stocks of creamery butter on hand in Canada amounted to 124,084,000 lb. Cold Storage warehouses had in store 89,540,000 lb. while dairy factories held 34,159,000 lb. The summary total was higher than last year by 22.2 million pounds. The five year average 1954-58 of September 1 stocks is 105,401,000 lb. The August 1959 "into-storage" movement was 12.7 million pounds as compared with a similar movement of 15.3 million pounds last year.

#### CHEDDAR CHEESE

The total stocks of cheddar cheese were 49,976,000 lb. consisting of 49,596,000 lb. Canadian and 380,000 lb. in transit. There were no stocks of imported cheddar cheese on hand on September 1, 1959. The summary total was lower than last year by 9.1 million pounds and showed an "into-storage" movement of 4.6 million pounds for August 1959.

#### CONCENTRATED MILK PRODUCTS

Stocks of evaporated whole milk held by or for manufacturers amounted to 63,600,000 lb. which was a decrease of 17.0 million pounds from last year. The "into-storage" movement of evaporated whole milk for August 1959 was 5.6 million pounds. Stocks of the chief by-product, skim-milk powder, amounted to 54,583,000 lb., a decrease of 19.6 million pounds over last year and a decrease of 9.7 million pounds from last month.

#### EGGS

The September 1, 1959 report shows 152,000 cases of cold storage eggs, 46,000 cases of fresh eggs and 1,000 cases shell eggs in transit.

Frozen eggs totalled 9,903,000 lb. being 908,000 thousand pounds lower than the 1958 figures. The "into-storage" movement for August 1959 was 512 thousand pounds as compared with a similar movement of 368 thousand pounds during August 1958.

#### POULTRY MEAT

The summary total of Dressed and Eviscerated poultry meat stocks on September 1, 1959 was higher than last year by 3.3 million pounds. An "into-storage" movement of 1.2 million pounds is shows for the month of August 1959. By kinds, the dressed and eviscerated quantities in stock, the latter in brackets, were; Chicken 1,370,000 lb. (2,624,000) lb., Fowl 1,571,-000 lb. (3,443,000) lb. and turkey 724,000 lb. (5,736,000) lb. These figures do not include estimates for firms whose reports were not received in time. There were 50,000 lb. of poultry meat in transit on September 1, 1959.
